Create noⁿbá (two) sentences using the words above. You may use previous vocabulary as well, e.g. the verb for “want, wish, hope for.”

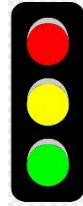

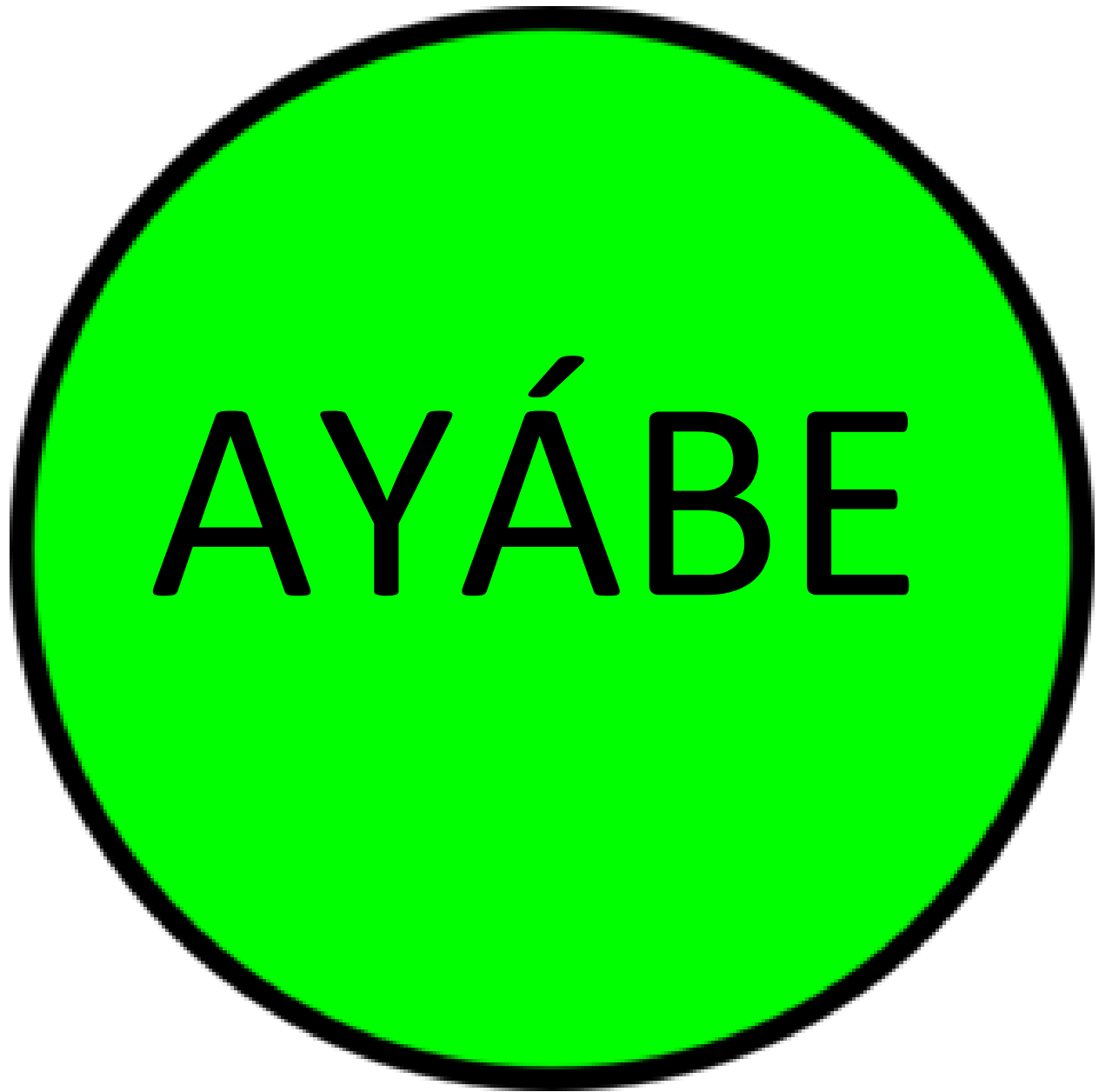
