The Kaáⁿze Alphabet

- On the introduction page below, you have a female saying hello. It is spelled **Hawé** and pronounced HAW-WEH. The “A” will ALWAYS make the “ah” sound like in “taco.” The “E” will ALWAYS make the “eh” sound like in “eggs.”
- The male says hello, **Ho**, and it is pronounced like it's spelled. The “O” will ALWAYS make the “oh” sound like in “auto.”
- The “I” in **wíta** is pronounced “ee” like in “pizza.” It will ALWAYS make this sound.
- Kaáⁿze vowels don't vary in sound.
- Use the alphabet chart to sound out the remaining words in this lesson.

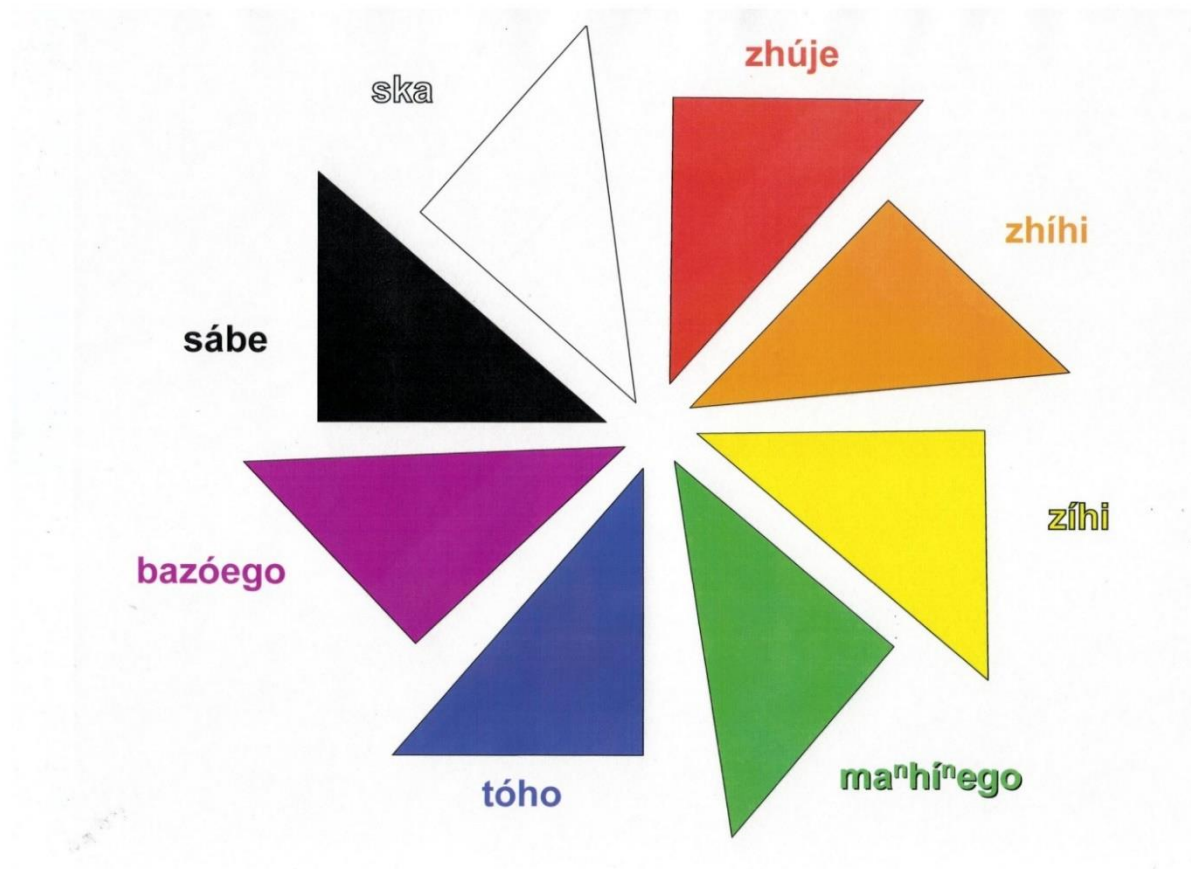

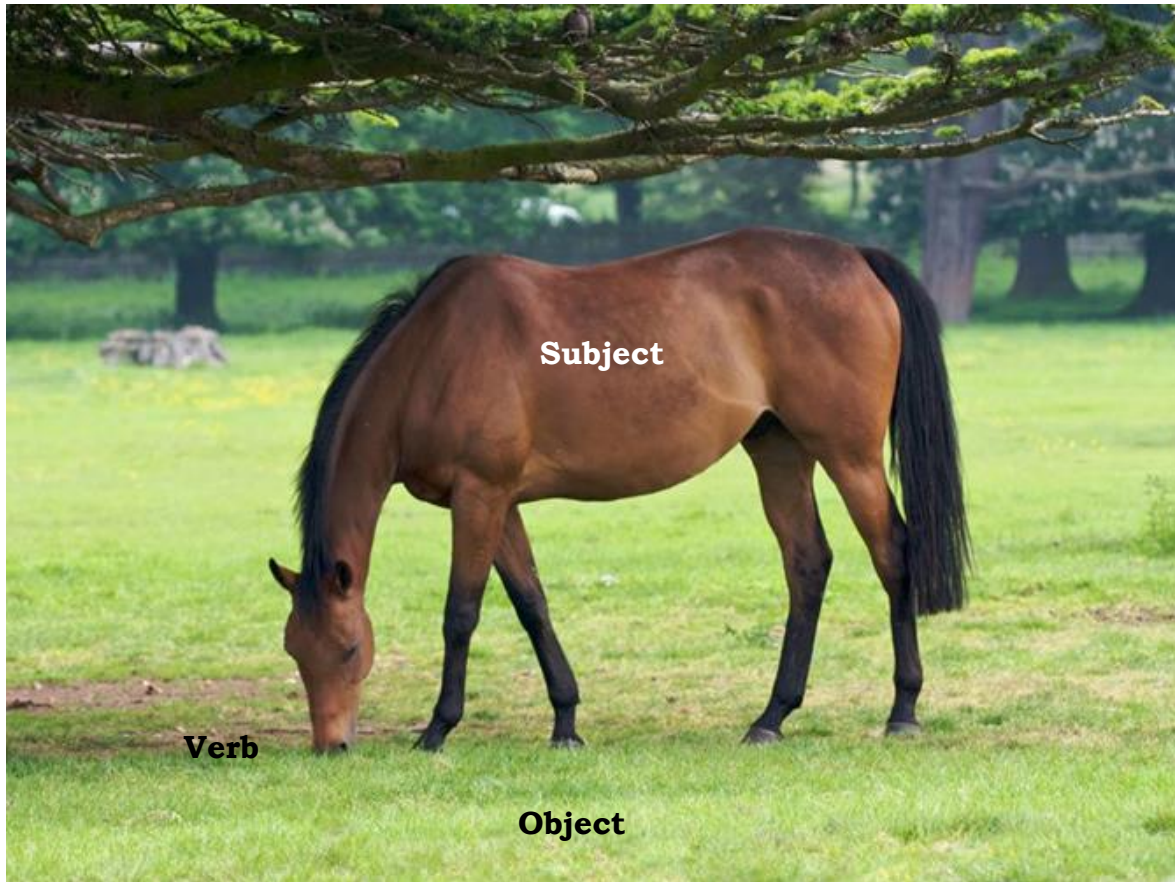

Wayáje (Word) Order

In Kaáⁿze Íe, the subject always comes first in a sentence, followed by the subject and then the verb.



Example:

Subject = Káwa

Object = Maⁿhíⁿ

Verb = Yaché

Kaáⁿze Íe Sentence:

Káwa maⁿhíⁿ yaché. (*Kah-wah ma-heen yah-che*)
(Horse) (Grass) (Eat).
